




# "Sustainable Healthcare Education: More Than Green Healthcare"

#### Sustainable Healthcare Education: What is it?

- Provides high-quality healthcare for all, without compromising the ability to meet the health needs of the next generation.
- This includes the prevention of illness, leaner care pathways, treatments with a lower carbon footprint where they exist, and an energy-efficient infrastructure.
- 'choosing wisely' reducing over-diagnosis, and over-treatment in the healthcare sector ('kloke valg')

Focuses often on 'green healthcare systems' and reduction of climate foot print of the healthcare sector

Also: focuses on the interconnectedness between human health, environmental health, and animal health

Often also focuses on the effects of climate on human health and subsequently how to gear ourselves for this (heat waves, shifting climate = migration of vector borne diseases, etc.)

However: we at SHE want to go beyond this – sustainability is about so much more! Climate is one aspects

True sustainability is also about equity and social justice – critical thinking and political change



- Situate the work of the centre in an international context.









## Centre for Sustainable Healthcare Education (SHE)-Resources & tools

□ Oslo Medical Corpus (OMC) - A digital platform for data-driven learning in health

The OMC is a large database of texts of different genres accompanied by a novel, open-source analysis and visualization interface aimed at exploring and understanding conceptual paradoxes and challenges. Designed for being used in *datathons* (collaborative problem-solving based on data).

#### ☐ Climate Health Toolkit

This student-led toolkit is the result of a nationwide project led by SHE, which aimed to map current teaching initiatives and develop new initiatives in collaboration between medical schools throughout Norway. It includes standardized learning outcomes for all medical specialties, as well as PowerPoint presentations and potential student assignments related to climate and health.









### Centre for Sustainable Healthcare Education (SHE)-Student-leadership schemes




#### ☐ SHE Student-Leaders Scheme

A group of 4-5 students take part in all aspects of the centre's operations, including course and program development and management, creation of educational resources and tools, project planning and execution, and sharing project results.

#### **☐** Students for Choosing wisely

A leadership programme designed to empower 15 students per cohort to lead projects related to the sustainable use of health resources, with the goal of countering overtreatment. Educational part + supervised project assignment. Collaboration with Legeforeningen.










# Centre for Sustainable Healthcare Education (SHE)-Scholarships & seed funding


☐ SHE Scholarships

SHE offers student scholarship that provide students with the opportunity to realise their own education or knowledge dissemination projects, preferably in partnership with a faculty member.

☐ Sustainable, evidence-based decision-making in Norwegian municipalities


The program offered scholarship to 20 students in GP practice to write and reflect on cases from their practice that involved sustainability dilemmas. These cases were collectively analyzed to foster normative and critical thinking competencies.





#### Centre for Sustainable Healthcare Education (SHE)- Exchange programmes

- SHE-WHO (PMNCH) exchange programme
- The Partnership for Maternal, Newborn & Child Health (PMNCH)
- •A group of 10 students will be offered the opportunity to intern with PMNCH, an initiative under the WHO that focuses on the health of children, adolescents, and women. The interns will be assigned to track the progress towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in three selected countries for each area of PMNCH's focus, based on desk studies.



Established in 2005, PMNCH is the world's largest alliance for women's, children's and adolescents' health and well-being, with +1,300 partner organizations working together through 10 constituency groups: partner governments, donors and foundations, NGOs, adolescent and youth groups, private sector organizations, health professional associations, academic and research institutions, global financing mechanisms, inter-governmental organizations, and UN agencies. PMNCH is hosted by the World Health Organization, based in Geneva.

Anchored in principles and values that cut across the sustainability goals


Takes future resources and needs into account

# Competencies for Sustainable Healthcare Education: Based on UNESCO's key competencies






### **Anticipatory competence**

 Anticipatory competence is the ability to collectively analyze, evaluate, and craft rich "pictures" of the future related to sustainability issues and sustainability problem-solving frameworks.





### **Systems-thinking competence**

 Systems-thinking competence is the ability to collectively analyze complex systems across different domains (society, environment, economy, etc.) and across different scales (local to global), thereby considering cascading effects, inertia, feedback loops and other systemic features related to sustainability issues and sustainability problem-solving frameworks.



- Normative competence is the ability to collectively map, specify, apply, reconcile, and negotiate sustainability values, principles, goals, and targets; often time in conflict with local needs, wants and values
- Collaboration competency: the abilities to learn from others; to understand and respect the needs, perspectives and actions of others (empathy); to understand, relate to and be sensitive to others (empathic leadership); to deal with conflicts in a group; and to facilitate collaborative and participatory problem solving.
