Notat til diskusjon om konkrete opptakskrav og fordelingsnøkkel for opptak av norske og internasjonale studenter.

Innspill til utforming av opptakskrav og fordelingsnøkkel for opptak av norske og internasjonale studenter til engelskspråklig Master in Human Geography, gjeldende fra og med høsten 2017

Som grunnlag til diskusjon har vi samlet her 6 modeller fra andre engelske masterprogrammer ved UiO, inkludert DEVGEO, til sammenligning med dagens ordning.

Sgeo ønsker å regulere opptaket gjennom opprettelse av kvoter tilknyttet ulike søknadsfrister for ulike studentgrupper, slik at søkere med søknadsfrist 15.april (norske og nordiske søkere, samt søkere med permanent eller fornybar oppholdstillatelse) skal utgjøre hoveddelen av studentene.

Forslag (UiO standard for English MA programs): Admission requirements

Admission to master's degree studies requires:

- Higher Education Entrance Qualification and a completed bachelor's degree comparable to a Norwegian bachelor's degree. Applicants with foreign education, please refer to the <u>country list</u>.
- a specialization defined by the programme
- a minimum grade average of C (in the Norwegian grading scale) or equivalent from the specialization in your degree.
- a language requirement documented by one of the tests/exams below:

a) Passed examination in English foundation course (140 hours/5 periods per week) in Norwegian upper secondary school with a minimum grade of 4 (or an equivalent grade from a Nordic upper secondary school) or alternatively passed examination in English from second and/or third school year, *or*b) An internationally recognised English language proficiency test.

Forslag: Required specialization

The required specialization for this programme is a:

- Bachelor's degree with a major or specialization in human geography; or

Bachelor degree incl. at least 90 HECs in human geography, geography, urban and regional planning or equivalent, and English B (from the Swedish upper secondary education or equal).

Selection

The selection of students is based on a cumulative assessment of one or more of the following factors: grades of academic courses, the quality/subject of the Bachelor's Thesis, relevant work and/or research experience, motivation letter and the relevance of previous studies in relation to the programme in question.

Application documentation specific for this programme

Besides the documents required by universityadmissions.se/antagning.se (Including proof of skills in English documented by English B from the Swedish upper secondary education or an internationally recognised test, e.g. TOEFL, IELTS or the equivalent.) we request the following documents with your application for the Master's Programme in Human Geography (120 credits):

1. Letter of purpose (maximum 1 page).

2. CV were you clearly states the name and main field of study for courses included in your bachelor's degree and the title of your bachelor thesis.
